I am delighted to be here this morning to celebrate the launch of the 4^t ^h edition of RC in Italy with sites in 5 cities across Italy and to cele brate the collaboration with the Agenzia del Demanio. We are absolutely delighted of this collaboration. To address the environmental and social challenges cities are facing, we need the support of everyone and we mus t create local cooperation among stakeholders to join force and make a d ifference together.

Before saying a few words about this new edition, let me First, tell you a bit about the history of Reinventing Cities.

9 years ago, I was working at the office of Anne Hidalgo, the Mayor of P aris, and we were looking for a way to encourage the built environment i ndustry to experiment new practices and to be more innovative.

We wanted to create a space where the industry would develop private pro jects that would not only serve their own interest and reproduce the bus iness as usual model, but that would instead serve the common good and s upport the environmental and social objectives of the City.

Reinventer Paris was born. It was a great success. and I think we can sa y that it has changed the way we build and develop urban project in Pari s.

Then, 7 years ago, I followed Anne Hidalgo, who was at this time becomin g chair of C40 and I joined this amazing organization that support citie s across the world to accelerate their climate actions and create a more sustainable and inclusive urban environment for all.

We proposed to the C40 board to experiment a competition similar to Rein venter Paris but this time, at the global scale and focusing not on inno vation - because innovation should not be the end goal - but focusing in stead on developing lighthouse zero carbon and inclusive urban regenerat ion that could inspire and be replicated across the world. It was a huge challenge. And I have to say Italian cities - and especial ly Milan and Roma were the first Cities on board with the initiative. 10 other cities joined the first edition of Reinventing cities along side M ilan and Roma and it was a hit - globally and especially in Italy, where , since the beginning of the Reinventing Cities the mobilization of Ital ian architects, developers, environmentalists, local organizations is ou tstanding.

Bologna joined the 3rd edition of Reinventing Cities with great success. Mayor Lepore, like Mayor Sala and Mayor Gualtieri, became a great suppor ter of Reinventing Cities. And I want to thank him and thank them for th is.

Today, by launching this new edition of Reinventing Cities in 5 Italian Cities - Milan, Roma, Bologna, Venice and Palermo and y collaborating wi th the Agenzia del Demanio - we are really making a difference, we are s caling up solutions for better future and we are creating a movement in Italy and globally with people and organizations that knows that we cann ot continue to develop our cities the we way we have done in the past 70 years, deteriorating our environment, heating up the climate and creatin g a model that does not work both for the planet and for the people.

We know that 40 to 50% of cities emission come from buildings. It is urg ent to change the way we plan, design, and build. And we know what needs to be done. We must especially better us the existing buildings to avoid this catastrophic circle of demolition reconstruction, we must develop t he use low-carbon and bio-based construction materials and foster the us e of renewable energy. We must also harness a urban planning apporach th at reduces car dependency, and fosters a model of city with medium densi ty, mixed-used, that provides access to essential services and that inte grates nature and green spaces that are key to reduce urban heat and cli mate risks that will only increase.

Today in Roma, 15 world-leading cities – Almere in the metropolitan area of Amsterdam, Bilbao, Bologna, Brussels, Glasgow, Milan, New York, Paler mo, Santiago de Chile, Rome, San Antonio, San Francisco, São Paulo, Seat tle and Venice are joining force to call on the private sector to collab orate with them to turn this vision into reality.

To date Reinventing Cities has engaged over 3,500 businesses worldwide w ith 40 projects that are now under development globally.

Through this new edition, Reinventing Cities aims to grow momentum and e ngage even more actors in rethinking cities globally.
